Reflection: Lent

Whether or not we find a period of reflection in the early spring a useful part of our spiritual lives, we all find ourselves in a state of "wilderness" sometimes. Traditionally Lent is a time of focusing on stripping away the non-essentials in our lifestyles and thereby concentrating on what is [spiritually] most important. How we approach this varies – I have set aside one item each day to give to the charity shop, or meditated on a series of readings, and no doubt we can all share experiences of doing without a favourite indulgence. But can such practices help when we are faced with a real-life wilderness experience?

Imagining Wilderness and experiencing it may be two different things. I can imagine it as being tossed on an open sea with no sight of land, or lost in an endless desert where nothing grows. Perhaps it is a wasteland where civilisation has been destroyed by war or earthquake or volcanic eruption, or swept away by floods. Some of these imagined visions are all too real for any people actually caught up in them. Others are closer to states of mind. For wilderness can be both. There are times when we all feel abandoned, and alone, and lost. There are situations when we need to escape but can find no way out.

I can offer no slick answers. I don't believe there are any. I believe many things *help*, though. The love of friends; having someone to talk to; faith in God; being surrounded by the natural world; the knowledge that "this too will pass"; being understood by others who have "been there"; being part of a community of faith that listens without judgement; the kindness of strangers. Knowing, deep inside, that the most profound darkness cannot withstand the lighting of a single flame. And seeing that the frozen snow cannot withstand the delicate petals of the crocus, when its time to bloom has come.
